

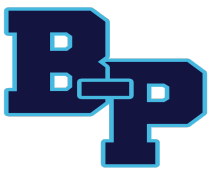
Bristol-Plymouth Junior & Senior Prom FAQs

- **When & where are the Junior and Senior Proms?**
 - **Junior Prom is Friday, April 12, 2024**, from 6:30 to 10:30 at the Miraval Ballroom, 838 N. Bedford Street in East Bridgewater, MA. Junior Prom Tickets shall go on sale Monday, March 18th, through Friday, April 5th, at \$75 per ticket.
 - **Senior Prom is Wednesday, May 29, 2024**, from 6-11 pm at the Lakeview Pavilion, 45 Lakeview Road, Foxboro, MA (This is also the last day of school for all senior students, with an early dismissal at 11 a.m. for seniors only!)

- **How do students purchase Junior and Senior Prom Tickets?**
 - Prom Tickets are available in room 361, Mrs. Holst's room, before homeroom and after school:
 - **Junior Prom Tickets: \$75 per ticket**
 - Ticket sales start Monday, March 18th & end Friday, April 5th
 - Juniors are required to present their B-P ID at the time of ticket purchase & select a table for themselves and their guest, if applicable.
 - **Senior Prom Tickets: \$120 per ticket**
 - Ticket sales start Monday, April 29th & end Tuesday, May 14th
 - Seniors are required to present their B-P ID & select a table for themselves and their guest, if applicable
 - **Payment: Cash, Checks, or Money Orders made payable to Bristol-Plymouth**
 - **Note: Students on the Obligations List and/or those on the Student Ineligibility List may not purchase tickets until all obligations and/or payments are rectified.**

- **What if the student has allergies or dietary restrictions?**
 - Food is included in the price of attending the proms.
 - **Students must identify any food allergies or dietary restrictions at the time of ticket purchase!**
 - Table selections and ticket numbers are used for the venue to identify allergies and avoid cross-contamination.

- **What is the dress code for the prom?**

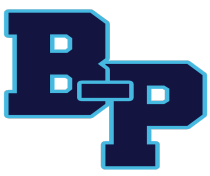
- Junior Prom is typically less formal than senior prom; however, semi-formal attire is what most students choose to wear for the junior prom and formal attire for the senior prom.
- **Note: there are no specific dress codes or restrictions for prom attire; however, vulgar or offensive clothing should be avoided as this is a school function, and the student-parent handbook dress code protocol is followed.**

- **Will there be photos available?**
 - Both the Junior and Senior Proms have a **PHOTO BOOTH** with either printed-out images for the students to keep and/or a link for downloads.
 - **Formal photos** are available for purchase:
 - Students who wish to purchase photos may have them taken at the event.
 - A link with images and payment options will be sent to their phone.

- **Are students allowed to bring a guest who does not attend Bristol-Plymouth?**
 - **YES!** Juniors and seniors can bring one guest under 21 years of age, yet, but older than middle school age.
 - If the **guest does not attend Bristol-Plymouth**, he or she must complete a **Guest Form**.
 - Any current Bristol-Plymouth student attending prom as a guest does NOT have to complete the Guest Form.
 - If the guest no longer attends high school and is 18 or older, he or she can sign the form themselves.

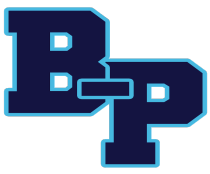
- **Can a Bristol-Plymouth student purchase a prom ticket if he or she is on the Student Obligation/Ineligibility List?**
 - **NO!** Student Obligations are cross-referenced at ticket purchase, as is the Student Ineligibility List.

- **How do students know if they are listed on the official Obligation/Ineligibility List?**

- The **Student Obligation/Ineligibility List** will be posted in the cafeteria under the student's B-P ID Number.
 - Students are encouraged to check the list **before GETTING IN LINE TO BUY TICKETS** to ensure they are eligible to purchase prom tickets.
- **What are Bristol-Plymouth Student Obligations?**
 - **Student Obligations** may include the following:
 - Unreturned Chromebooks or technology devices/chargers
 - Overdue library book(s) & calculator(s)
 - Cap & Gown payment
 - Outstanding academic or technical materials (including textbooks)
 - Athletic items (uniforms, equipment, etc.)
 - Senior project supplies
 - Emergency cards (nurses' office each year)
 - Physical exam (1 on file for all 4 years)
 - **Students must return obligations or pay outstanding balances to be removed from the Student-Obligation List and avoid being placed on the Student-Ineligibility List**
- **What is the Student Ineligibility List?**
 - Students on the **Ineligibility List** are **NOT** allowed to participate in **any extracurricular activities**, including, but not limited to:
 - **Prom**
 - School Dances
 - Sports
 - Co-op
 - **Students who have paid their outstanding balances to the school district and/or have met their course requirements shall be removed from the Ineligibility List.**
- **Are students allowed to be dismissed early on the day of the Bristol-Plymouth prom?**
 - Senior students will have a half day on the day of Senior Prom; therefore, no early dismissal approval is required.
 - Juniors attending the B-P prom who wish to be dismissed on the day of the Junior Prom must complete the **Google Form Request** attached: [Junior Prom Early Dismissal](#)
 - Junior co-op employers will be notified of the date of junior prom.

- Juniors on co-op that day may choose to come to school instead if they wish to be dismissed early.
- Juniors on co-op may also ask their employers to leave at 11 a.m. or choose to work a full day.
- **Are students allowed to attend prom if they miss the school day?**
 - **No!** Prom attendees and their guests **MUST** be in school by homeroom and stay until approved dismissal time.

★ **Important Information** excerpted from Bristol-Plymouth Student/Parent Handbook regarding the School Dance Policy:

- **Students are expected to arrive at prom within one hour of start time.**
- Students leaving the building/venue must immediately leave the school premises and cannot return to the dance.
- All guests must be a high school student or under 21 years of age.
- No middle school students are allowed to attend.
- **All students and guests must sign-in at the door and present a clear photo I.D. (B-P Student ID, Driver's License, etc.)**
- Tickets are **NOT** sold at the door & only pre-approved and registered guests are permitted.
- **Bristol-Plymouth students are responsible for the behavior of their guests.**
- **In accordance with state law, NO smoking/ vaping is allowed on the school campus or at a school-sponsored event at an off-campus venue.**
- **The Discipline Code binds students at all school functions, including dances/proms.**
